

Design and make your own boat that will float on water.




Research the artist Paul Klee. He 'took a line for a walk'. Let your pencil lead you around the page then colour the different parts in.



Make your own puppet using a sock. Can you sew some parts on?




The primary colours are red, blue and yellow. Using these colours only, mix them to make different colours. Paint a picture using these colours.

Using mini marshmallows or blu-tack/playdough, and tooth picks, make 3D shapes.



Write your name in bubble writing. Draw inside the things that represent you.



Make your own monster bookmark.



Become a portrait artist. Using pictures of your family, sketch out their face. Think about the dimensions of where the features should go.
