### Barriers to future attainment for pupils eligible PP

- Baseline levels for some 'areas of development', particularly the prime areas, such as reading, writing, maths and physical are significantly below the level at which they are expected. for those children eligible for PP
- Many Pupils come from homes that are unable to support a positive reading culture and do not have access to quality reading books for the children to read.
- Some of families are subject to poor living environment, unemployment and deprivation , all of which can be barriers to learning for some of our children.
- The wellbeing of the children and their families returning to school after the COVID 19 lockdown.
